 Mr. Rizza explains that these are the largest transfers they will see, again transferring to several accounts and taking it from other accounts that have excess money. Basically this is cleaning up everything that is left with a negative or positive balance. One thing he did not say initially is that with both of these transfers, they go to the Board of Finance for discussion and vote and then it is referred to the Town Council for review and approval; this is procedurally in the Charter.

# No public comment.

### Council comment:

- Councilman William Richardson asks about the three salary accounts, what are they for.
- Mr. Rizza says Police, Counseling & Community Services and the new dispatch center. With some of the accounts, they were in negotiations with the union or with Counseling they use an outside agency. From the time when the budget is passed in April 2014 a lot of things happen; increases happen due to contract negotiations. Usually, they don't put money into the Department prior to the contract being negotiated and the Council approving it. Two of the Departments were brand new.
- Chairman Parlato asks about the \$274,500 from the contingency, does that just about clean it out or is there money left in there.
- Mr. Rizza says there is some money left but not a lot; less than \$1,000. He says
  they did rather well, this is the last transfer of the year and they had roughly
  \$275,000 left in contingency. During the year as money moves from account to
  account, for the most part a lot of the individual departments had overage in one
  account and a surplus in another so they took care of it within.

- Attorney Zullo explains that although this is being considered at the Public
  Hearing tonight it does not appear on the Special Meeting agenda which follows
  this meeting. Because it is a Special Meeting there are no additions allowed to
  this agenda so this will be taken up on December 1<sup>st</sup> at the next meeting.
- Councilman Parlato explains that for a Regular Meeting the Council has the
  ability to add to the agenda but at a Special Meeting they do not because of the
  FOI laws so that nothing can be snuck in. In addition, Paul Rizza is very open to
  all members when they get the packet if they need any information on it or have
  a question he is very receptive of it and very thorough. They can make contact
  with him or do it through the Chairman if they do not have time to do so.
